Ronald W. Frank



(attended 1952-1965) - Ronald W. Frank graduated from Springdale High School in 1965 as an Honor Student. He went on to study at Carnegie Mellon University, graduating with a Bachelor of Science Degree in chemical engineering. Frank continued his education at Duke University's School of Law. He returned to Pittsburgh in 1972 and currently serves as a partner at Reed Smith, with extensive experience in corporate finance, energy, and international transactions. For his efforts, Frank has been listed in *The Best Lawyers in America* since 2006 and has been selected as Pittsburgh's 2012 *Mergers & Acquisitions Lawyer of the Year*. He has served on over 18 non-profit boards; endowed scholarships to Carnegie Mellon University, Duke University, and Washington & Jefferson College; worked as the National Fundraising Chairman for CMU's \$100 million campaign; and helped to develop an educational foundation for the Allegheny Valley School District. Frank also spends his time helping young people in the North Hills Amateur Radio Club and volunteering at his local church. He has touched numerous people through his work, his actions, and his philanthropic activities.

David joined his father's dental practice after graduation 34 years ago. Mock's career has always been matched by his willingness to help others. He acts as a mentor to undergraduate dental students, provides several scholarships for Springdale Jr-Sr High School students, and assists numerous underprivileged young people with dental care. Mock is a member of the Allegheny Valley Rotary Club and is a Rotary Paul Harris Fellow and past president. He serves as the president of both Delta Sigma Delta dental alumni chapter and Sigma House Association. For his efforts, Mock has been chosen by his peers as *Pittsburgh's Top Dentist* for the last four years. Bruno Moretti



(attended 1961-1974) - Bruno Moretti grew up in Harwick and attended schools in the Allegheny Valley School District, graduating in 1974. When a disability forced retirement, Moretti went back to school to secure an Associate's Degree in Business Management and began focusing on his interest in Emergency Management. Currently, he is one of the most certificated individuals in Emergency Management throughout the state of Pennsylvania. His service to his community goes beyond the expected, volunteering with two local fire departments and as the Springdale Borough Emergency Management Coordinator. Over the years, Moretti founded safety programs for Allegheny Valley students, served as Scout Master for the Boy Scouts, and coached softball for Lower Valley. He has touched the lives of numerous people and holds a high standard for community service. He has shown that one person from a small town can make a difference.

Conrad Susa



(attended 1949-1953) – Conrad Susa graduated from Springdale High School in 1953. He attended the Carnegie Institute of Technology, receiving a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree. He went on to receive a Master of Science Degree from the Juilliard School of Music in New York City and joined the faculty of the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Currently, he serves as the Chair of the Composition Department and Professor of Music History and Literature. Susa has held many prestigious positions over the years and written numerous scores for documentary and commercial films, television productions, and choral and instrumental works. Susa is internationally known for his operas, with his work, *Transformations*, one of the most frequently performed operas by an American composer. His numerous awards include two Ford Foundation Fellowships, a National Endowment Consortium Grant, a George Gershwin Memorial Scholarship, and a Gretchaninoff Prize. He continues to be known as a beloved teacher, an internationally revered academic and composer, and a person admired and respected for his contributions to society.
